We unveiled a new website and logo!




Seven "Journey Groups" explored Transforming Questions of




Episcokids loved Wonderful Wednesdays – activity centers on the patio exploring a Bible story.




WNN Food Pantry opened on first Saturdays to accommodate working families. St. Thomas members served as WNN Shoppers to support the pantry.








Coffee hour moved outside, and we love it!




The parlor got a new roof. Our grounds got extra care. Our Property Committee worked hard all year.

UNDERSTANDING OUR FINANCE REPORTS

Your pledges and gifts support all St. Thomas ministries.

In 2021, the congregation gave **above and beyond** to support our shared work. Thank you!

Our 2021 budget **anticipated** limited activities. We set aside funds to use if we began meeting in person.

Program areas that appear over budget for 2021 were able to **resume in-person activities** and used some of those reserved funds. This is good!

Property expenses were over budget due to much needed maintenance. That is why we created the **Continuing**Faithfulness Capital Fund to address major repairs.

We are launching a **young adult ministry** in 2022. Due to staffing changes, we did not begin in 2021.

The increase in **payroll and benefits** for 2022 includes increases for staff, health benefits for a full-time sexton and kitchen manager, and funds for calling an assisting priest.

Other income includes reimbursements by groups using our campus, funds reserved to support meeting in person, and support from two endowment funds.

Endowment draws for 2021 were 3.5% of the average over the past three years, to encourage growth and keep up with inflation. Our endowments are to support St. Thomas in the future as well as now

The **designated account** includes payments for the choir's Ireland pilgrimage in 2022, funds held in reserve, the capital fund, and special gifts for restricted use.

The **Outreach budget** is based on 10% of budgeted pledges minus our diocesan pledge. As pledges increase, our Outreach budget also increases."
