







### SUMMER OF SERVICE

You may have heard about **Phase I** of our strategic planning process - a proposal to improve accessibility on our campus by creating a driveway closer to the doors, adding parking spaces and a covered drop off near the chapel, and creating an accessible altar rail and choir area in the nave. Those plans are being refined over the summer. We hope to have detailed designs ready to share with you by the fall.

Now it is time for **Phase II** of our strategic planning process - focused on **outreach.** We gather for worship to be sent out into the world, to love and serve the Lord by loving and serving our neighbors. St. Thomas has a long history of loving service in our community: Wynnton Neighborhood Network food pantry and utility assistance, a thriving partnership with Brewer Elementary, partnership with CVEM and East Carver Heights, Path to Shine and soccer and FANN, computers for students at Msalato Theological College in Tanzania, care for the environment, and more.

We also serve through the work of our parishioners. Many among us work and volunteer with nonprofits that make a difference in our community. On Sunday mornings this summer, parishioners will share about these organizations. We are also scheduling times to volunteer together. Our **Summer of Service** will culminate in an outreach discernment afternoon on Sunday, August 6, a time to pray and explore together how to deepen our impact on the community around us.

God is calling us in this season to look both inward and outward - to Love God, Love Every Person, Learn **AND SERVE** Together. What a gift it is to have so many ways of serving and making a difference.

We're asking ministry leaders to let us know what needs they have that we might be able to meet by collecting items this summer. We'll be intentional with our asks and offer a variety of giving options.


### **Serve Together**



#### **Pride Festival**



You're invited to join us behind the scenes at GoodwillSR on Friday, June 2 from 2:00-4:00 pm to learn about everything Goodwill does in our community!



Support for WNN

desperately needs your

support. The need for food is so great. Cars start lining up as early as 8AM to be sure they are one of the 25 served when the doors open at 10AM. At present that is the number that can be handled, but with your help we can feed more.

June is the month St. Thomas is asked to contribute to the Food **Bank.** Canned goods are especially needed from the congregation. Each Individual or family that comes to WNN is given canned goods of soup, meat, tomato sauce, fruit, beans, corn, green beans and mixed vegetables. That is 8 cans per family, times 25 people served per day, times 5 days would be 1000 cans needed per week. Also dry goods of cereal, rice and pasta; that is 3 items, for 25 people per day, times 5 days which is 375 items per week. These are the items most asked for from the congregations. It is a wonderful help if the canned goods are purchased and given to WNN. It is helpful if the canned goods are bought in flats of 12 at places like Aldi or Wal-Mart. (This greatly helps the volunteer staff of WNN to keep from having to shop for these items each day to restock the shelves for the next day.) All staff at WNN are volunteers from 8 congregations: 6 Protestant churches and 2 Jewish congregations. St Thomas has at least 20 volunteers who work as greeters, on the computer, in the pantry and as shoppers. If you are interested in volunteering, your time would be greatly appreciated.

Cash donations are very much appreciated as well. WNN uses the cash donations to provide meat, milk, butter, toilet paper, detergent pods and soap. Fresh fruits and vegetables are purchased when available. Utilities assistance is also provided once a year per guest. In the past, Feeding the Valley was able to supply WNN with USDA Food - canned goods, mac and cheese, rice, as well as frozen meat. As a partner with FTV, we are able to purchase such items at 19 cents per pound to offset their shipping and storage costs. Unfortunately, Feeding the Valley's inventory is very low due to multiple reasons, which forces WNN to shop retail and pay high grocery prices. We are hopeful this situation will improve but it is our reality for now.

WNN Food Bank thanks you for any help you can provide giving food and assistance to the families and individuals who desperately need your help.

# THIS WE BELIEVE



In Lent and Easter seasons, our Journey Groups studied the Nicene Creed, a statement of faith we confess together in worship almost every Sunday. A sermon series during Lent and Easter, titled This We Believe, also focused on the Nicene Creed. Since the 4th century, when it was written by two councils of bishops, the Nicene Creed and the earlier Apostles' Creed have summarized the core of Christian doctrine for churches around the world.

The work of summarizing what Christians believe did not stop in the 4th century, however. As an example, The Episcopal Church added questions to our Baptismal Covenant when the Book of Common Prayer was revised in 1979 (see page 304). These were a modern way of summarizing what we believe the Christian life looks like when we live out our hope in God.

In the final week of Journey Groups, Denny Clark, our Parish Theologian, shared another recent summary of Christian faith. It was developed in 1968 by the United Church of Canada, the largest Protestant Christian group in Canada and is widely used in their worship. Titled "A New Creed," it was not written to replace the Apostles' or Nicene Creeds but to act as a supplement to these statements of faith. It has been revised a few times. The latest version is below.

Several people who participated in Journey Groups asked if we might share this statement of faith and meditate on it together over the summer, as another way of expressing our hope in God. Feel free to use this in your prayers at home or in discussion with others as you consider what you believe and how your faith shapes your life.

We are not alone, we live in God's world.

We believe in God:
who has created and is creating,
who has come in Jesus,
