At the Easter Vigil each year (April 16 at 6:30, this time), a cantor chants the Exsultet, a beautiful ancient proclamation of Easter. As the cantor sings, the congregation sits in darkness and lights candles from the new Paschal Candle, sharing the light of Christ.

The chant breaks the night with these words - "**Rejoice now.**" The words are on page 286 in the Prayer Book.

Rejoice now, heavenly hosts and choirs of angels, and let your trumpets shout salvation, for the victory of our mighty king.

More than any other season of the year, Easter invites us to **Rejoice**. Easter recognizes that life is not all sunshine. The first proclamation of Easter begins in darkness. We all go through times when rejoicing may seem out of place.

But still, we can **Rejoice Now.**

Rejoice in the hope of peace in a world bent on war. Rejoice in God's abundance in the face of scarcity. Rejoice in the promise of life in the midst of death. Rejoice in gifts of community and purpose and growth. Rejoice and sing now, all the round earth, bright with a glorious splendor, for darkness has been vanquished by our eternal King.

Children will go to children's chapel during the lessons and sermon and return for baptism and Eucharist.



Easter Sunday April 17, 9 & 11 am

Two nearly identical services at 9 am (no incense) and 11 am (with incense) with brass and glorious music to celebrate the risen Christ. A simple breakfast will be available outside and in the parish hall. Children and families are invited to flower the cross outside as you arrive.
